

ARTICLES FOR OUR NEWSLETTER *LE BÉ*

In accordance with the editing tradition set for articles published in the ADA's newsletter, texts submitted for publication should have some link with the path and development of a particular Dubé family. Essentially, Dubés in America were born to Mathurin Dubé and Marie Campion. A large number of Dubés living in English-speaking environments have modified the spelling of their name, and we hold no restriction on such spelling (Dubay, Dubey, Dubie or other spellings). If the author could insert in his text sufficient genealogical information to clearly establish a link to Mathurin Dubé and Marie Campion, his contribution would become much more valuable.

On the other hand, the article should preferably be more than a simple sequence of genealogical data. The author could insert elements taken from the oral tradition to describe the arrival of their Dubé ancestor in his English-speaking environment - approximate date, place of work, type of employment - and the development of his progeny in his new environment. The author could give more detailed information on his current family situation, such as professional achievements, particular skills, recreational activities, hobbies or major events in the life of his family members. Pictures could highlight the document, but without overwhelming the text. All photographs should be explained by a **legend**, clearly identifying the persons shown.

The text should be **at least four but no more than ten pages** long. The number of pictures should of course be proportional to the number of pages, the average being no more than two per page. The text should be sent **electronically in Word format** so as to facilitate editing for publication in our newsletter *Le Bé*. Pictures could be inserted in the text or sent separately in jpeg format. If the pictures are digitalized, they should be at least 300 DPI. We might ask the author of the article to forward us a copy of some genealogical documents if, according to our editors, they could be of particular usefulness to us. Our document editors would do the appropriate formatting before posting the text in the Members Only subsection of our website. After approval of their texts by the Evaluation Committee, authors would be issued a user number and a password giving them access to documents posted in the secure section of the website, including their own contribution. This special authorization would last a few months but no more than a year.
